

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From the Desk of Deacon Tim:

A summer day's musing.

Ever wondered what Episcopalians believe about Mary, the mother of Jesus? Or wondered, Why does St. Michael's keep a statue of Mary near the tabernacle and side altar? Or, How do people who identify as women see God's image reflected in themselves, particularly as we hear Jesus taught us to pray "Our Father . . . "? Where might the Virgin Mary and other women of scripture have a place in our faithful imagination?

The catechism of the Book of Common Prayer states that when we confirm that Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, we mean that by God's own act, his divine Son received human nature from his mother, the Virgin Mary. (BCP p. 849). The Book of Common Prayer further honors Mary in providing her Song of Praise, her response to her cousin's blessing prayer ("Hail Mary, full of grace . . . "), as the default canticle for Evening Prayer:

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my savior; for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed; the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name . . . (BCP p. 119)

Mary's song continues to prophesy that God re-orders the world's expectations ("he has scattered the proud in their conceit . . . cast down the mighty . . . lifted up the lowly . . . filled the hungry with good things . . . sent the rich away empty"). And most of all, God is fulfilling the promise of merciful salvation made to Abraham and all his children for ever.

Mary is not only the God-bearer, she is like John the Baptist, a proclaimer of Gospel good news at work in the world through the person of Jesus. She is a forerunner of the apostles and all disciples of Jesus Christ. We align with and follow Mary's example when we commit to respect the dignity of every human being in our Baptismal Covenant.

Among the treasured books on my bookshelves is *Bible Women: All Their Words and Why They Matter*, by Lindsay Hardin Freeman, an Episcopal priest. I especially like that Rev. Freeman includes women of scripture whose names are not recorded there. Lifting up the lowly, indeed!



With thanksgiving to God, Archbishop Joseph Garang is pleased to announce the date for Ordination and Consecration of Bishop Simon Chuang Ayok Deng,

third Bishop of Renk Diocese, and Bishop in the Church of God, at St. Matthew Cathedral, Renk Town, July 16, 2023.

St. Michael's and Renk Diocese have been in a Covenant of Relationship since January 1998, and the Diocese of Chicago and Renk Diocese have had a Companion Diocese Relationship, passed by resolution at Diocesan Convention, since 2001. The CDR has been renewed by resolution every 5 years by delegates to Convention.

St. Michael's partnership with Renk Diocese includes the building of Renk Theological College, rebuilding it when destroyed by the government of Sudan, and ongoing scholarship support of seminarians. Over the years, parishioners have visited Renk, and Archbishop Joseph has visited St. Michael's and the Diocese of Chicago.
