

April 9


Easter Sunday services will be at 9 AM and 11 AM.

# Special Outreach Guest Speakers Sunday, March 12

Last year the Outreach Team began a program of inviting grant recipients to share the work of their ministry with the congregation on Sunday mornings. This week we are honored to have 2 speakers from Chalice House at the 8 and 10 a.m. services. Please welcome and meet and greet them at both coffee hours, where they will answer your questions.

Laura Mandell and Christine Organ are co-chairs of Chalice House, a home in Palatine, which provides community-based housing to immigrants legally seeking asylum in the U.S. Countryside Church Unitarian Universalist started the program in partnership with Interfaith Community for Detained Immigrants in 2019. It is currently supported by ten Community Partners (including St. Michael's Episcopal Church) and dozens of individuals who fund the cost of housing.

Our first Chalice House family -- Jerry, Sandra, and 4-year-old Zenaba -- arrived from the Democratic Republic of the Congo, via Brazil and Texas, in 2020. Within two years, the family learned English, learned how to use public transportation, earned their driver's licenses, and found employment. They moved into their own apartment in July, 2022.

Our second residents arrived in December 2022. Berlin is a 22-year old young man from Guatemala. A family of three from Columbia – Marlon, Vicky and 11-year old Angel are also residing in the home.

The Chalice House model has been recognized as a 'gold standard' by national organizations because of the coalition of partners who are working together. The model allows families to stay together and provides individuals with the dignity and support they deserve while they wait for their asylum case to make its way through the courts.

### One Book, One Diocese

On April 13 and 25, people from across the Diocese of Chicago will gather on Zoom to discuss Resurrection Hope: A Future Where Black Lives Matter by the Very Rev. Dr. Kelly Brown Douglas, dean of Episcopal Divinity School at Union Theological Seminary and canon theologian at the Washington National Cathedral.

Douglas will speak about her book via Zoom during the session on April 25 from 7 to 9 p.m. Central. Register to attend.

"I'm delighted to welcome my friend and colleague Kelly Brown Douglas back to our diocese, even if only via Zoom," Bishop Paula Clark said. "Kelly's visionary theological work continues to guide us from despair to hope as we continue the journey toward the Beloved Community that God intends for us."

The programs, presented by the diocesan Peace and Justice Committee and the Anti-Racism Commission, are the first in a "One Book, One Diocese" initiative that Ellen Lindeen, chair of the Peace and Justice Committee, modeled on the Chicago Public Library's popular "One Book, One Chicago" program.

# **Email Scams Continue**

New "Phishing" technique targets directories, databases

Many congregations and dioceses have experienced email scams, in which emails appearing to be from the bishop or a clergy leader solicit church members to send money, provide information, or purchase gift cards. Recently, several congregations were targeted by individuals asking parishioners to "join the church directory and make an online contribution."

This is a form of email "phishing" known as "whaling." Please be assured that neither Bishop Clark nor any clergy or diocesan staff member will ask you for money, gift cards, or send database links, and any requests for these items should be deleted.

If you have questions about an email you have received:

- · Carefully check the sender's name and email address
- · Look out for misspelled words and incorrect grammar
- Do not click on any suspicious links or attachments
- Report the email as spam
