***From the Desk of Deacon Tim:***



This week I am remembering fondly The Reverend Mark McIntosh. Some readers here may recall Mark and his family worshipping with St. Michael's in the 1990's and early 2000's, before Mark took positions with Durham University in the UK and Durham Cathedral. I just finished reading, Seeds of Faith, a 2022 book that Mark wrote with The Most Reverend Frank T. Griswold, the 25th Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church, along with a companion book they co-wrote, Harvest of Hope. The "seeds" book reads like

a discussion between good friends of longstanding about faith and theology. I understand that the "harvest" book (on my list to be read) addresses practices for prayerful interaction with scriptures. Mark and Bishop Griswold have each died since they wrote the pair of "seeds and harvest" books.

The next to last chapter of Seeds of Faith takes up theological insight about -- as they perceive the issues -- the end of this life and transition to another form of life in and with God the Trinity. There is poignancy here as Mark briefly and gently mentions his experience with approaching physical death ("ALS has brought to stillness and silence much of who I was"). Mark quotes at one point the mystical theologian Thomas Traherne in support of an insight that "God's overwhelming generosity to us, even now in our mortal life, has the power to open our minds and hearts to the great Giver of all gifts -- and so help us by means of this contemplation to begin right now to live in the heart of God."

I hope to share with you more of Mark's gracious insights in coming weeks. It would please me if mutual discussion were to unfold. Should you like copies of the books for your own shelf, And All The Angels gift shop is offering to take orders, with their "profits" dedicated in support of charitable organizations focusing upon children and women.

It seems to me fitting that I encountered Mark's writing again in this time of transition from summer to approaching autumn, from summertime to schooltime. I remember crossing paths outside of church with Mark way north in Wisconsin about this time of year, each of us "dads" picking up children from summer camp. May your transitions be blessed with grace and peace.



## RECIPE

### Spinach and Mushroom Hash Brown Bake

Based on a strata recipe submitted by Mary Alice Linde and found on page 86 of the 1991 edition of the St. Michael's Parish cookbook, *Let Us Break Bread Together*



#### Ingredients

6 eggs  
2 cups milk  
16 to 20 ounces shredded hash browns, defrosted  
10 package frozen chopped spinach, defrosted, drained and pressed dry  
8 ounces sliced mushrooms  
1 cup grated cheddar cheese  
1 teaspoon salt  
2 tablespoons chopped onion  
¼ teaspoon each – tarragon and onion powder  
½ teaspoon each – paprika and celery salt

#### Instructions

Spray 9"x13"x2" baking dish with cooking spray and preheat the oven to 325 degrees.

Combine eggs and milk, beat well. Add remaining ingredients and stir to combine.

Pour into the prepared pan and bake uncovered 45 minutes to 1 hour, until set and slightly browned around the edges. Check after 30 minutes and if the casserole is browning too quickly, lay a piece of aluminum over the top and cook until set.

Let the pan sit for 5 to 10 minutes before serving.
