FROM THE LIFT LEADER'S DESK

We've had a fabulous kick-off this year! We had nine and ten LIFTers, respectively, for the first two weeks of coming back together! God is blessing our program and certainly **the parents get the credit** for getting their tweens and teens out of the bed and to LIFT on Sunday mornings. Bless you and thank you, parents! I'm so excited to be back with the LIFT kids!

This past Sunday we did *Gospel Theatre*. Four of the kids acted out the gospel reading, Matt.18:21-35. A king (Jackson) wanted to collect his debt from a slave, but after the slave begged forgiveness - he owed *10,000 talents* - the king was compassionate and forgave this massive debt of the unmerciful slave (Sam). The unmerciful slave turned around and would not forgive a fellow slave (Gaius), who only owed the unmerciful slave *10 talents*, and had the debtor thrown into jail. Other slaves (the rest of the class) witnessed this, and one (Winston) went back and told the king what occurred. The king then had the unmerciful slave thrown into prison until he could work and pay off what he owed.

I think the gospel comes alive when the kids act it out, especially when encouraged to "give me more emotion!" At the very least, it IS more fun! I explained to the LIFTers that Jesus often exaggerated to make a point - I mean 10,000 talents to 10 talents?? Come on... But Jesus' point was to show the exponential capacity of forgiveness that our Father has for us. There is a lot to ponder in that story.

Last time, I wrote about two very special people who for many years have been selfless in serving our youth: Ric Lindeen and Paul Carrubba. If you did not read the Sword for Sept. 7, please pull it up and do so. My little tribute is hardly representative of what these two gentlemen have done and what they have meant to me.

Our Next Food Drive: This Weekend!

St. Michael's partner in this weekend's Food Drive is Food For Greater Elgin, the second largest pantry in Kane County, which served 160,000 people in 2022-23. This organization has increased its reach and involvement in the area, serving guests on day and evening shifts (very helpful for working families), and acquired more space in which to store and deliver food as conditions worsened for area guests. FFGE spent \$36,000 to purchase food in 2020, and \$200,000 in the past year. According to a recent statistics, prices of basic food items have increased between **52-70%** in the past year, and between **1-2 million** people in Illinois have lost SNAP benefits to buy food. The combined impacts of rising food prices, overall inflation, and loss of pandemic-related aid have hit hard for many families and individuals.




